Leslie introduced the speaker, Jennifer McKay, Policy Director of the Water Shed Council for the Tip of the Mitt for 15 years. She gave an interesting talk about the rising water in the inland lakes in Michigan stating that the reason they have found is that the soil is very saturated. It is the wettest it has been for the last 12 to 60 months. Using a number of charts she showed that the Kettle lakes, lakes with no outlet, as our lake is, are very susceptible to rising waters. She talked about a number of things related to this problem, including what property owners can do and what they shouldn't do. Sand bags don't work and sea walls cause damage. The best recommendations are bioengineering or moving the homes away from the water. She also talked about the problems with septic tanks and drinking water and the real danger to people with any electric hookups some may have on their docks or submerged boathouses.
