Dear Parents and Guardians:

Your child's health and safety at camp are of great importance to the Health & Wellness staff. This letter is to inform you of procedures in the Health Center so you may prepare your child before camp for any health needs he/she may have

**Health forms are required for each session your child attends. Health forms are not held over from previous sessions due to the need to archive all forms at the end of each session as required by law.*

Please insure that **all** information on the health form is current, accurate, and complete. This will enable us to provide proper treatment for your child in case of an emergency. This includes specific information on how to reach YOU at a moment's notice, if necessary. Please attach a copy of the child's insurance card to the health form. Please also note that for Diabetes, Asthma, and Anaphylaxis there are additional addendum forms that must be filled out. You may download these at www.lakelouisecommunity.org .

All medication must be given to the Health Officer at check in. This includes over-the-counter medication as well as vitamins or alternative/homeopathic medications. Pack their medication in a zip lock bag, in the original container, separate from the camper's luggage. Please label with the camper's name. Campers are **not** allowed to have any medication in their possession or in their cabins with the exception of: rescue asthma inhalers, EPI-Pens and diabetic supplies. We recommend that your child's ADD medication **not** be interrupted during their camp stay.

**If the camper carries any of the above supplies with them, it is helpful for him/her to have a fanny pack with them at camp. Also, the Health Center Staff must still be notified what the camper has with them.*

**If the dose of medication the camper is receiving is different than the pharmacy or container label states, a new prescription stating the current dosage, signed by the camper's physician must be included. This applies to over-the-counter medications as well if the dosage is different than what's stated on the label.*

The Health Center does carry a limited number of over-the-counter medications (for the complete list refer to your health form) to treat minor conditions such as headache, nausea, constipation, and allergic reactions. These products will be given per manufacturer's instructions. If you do **not** want your camper to receive these, please cross them off as indicated on your child's health form.

The Health Center is open for regular scheduled medications 30 mins. before meals and 30 mins. before bedtime. Campers are welcome to come with a buddy before meals for their medications or wait to be called outside the dining hall by a staff member 15 mins. before each meal.

Non-emergency medical issues are taken care of immediately after meals. The Health Officer is available 24 hours a day for emergencies. The Health Center is not equipped to

handle overnight stays so parents will be called to pick up their child if he/she requires overnight care due to illness. Campers may return to camp when they have recovered from their illness, have been fever free for 24 hours or with a Doctor's permission to return to camp and are evaluated by a Health Officer upon arrival to Lake Louise.

If your child has a history of bed wetting, you may want to consider using "pull-ups" at night while at camp. The campers are extremely active during the day and tend to sleep very deeply at camp. Some who have not had an accident in the past year may have a problem while at camp. Pull-ups can be distributed to your camper in a confidential manner at bedtime. We want to limit any embarrassment to your child and protect their privacy.

All campers **need** to bring a water bottle to camp. We encourage campers to fill these at every meal to prevent the effects of dehydration. Please send one (labeled with camper's name).

Sunscreen and non-aerosol insect repellent are important. Campers may keep these with them. An SPF of 30 or above is recommended. Campers are encouraged to apply sunscreen and insect repellent whenever they leave their cabins.

Please be sure your camper has "broken in" the shoes, boots, and/or sandals they bring to camp. They will be doing lots of running and walking at camp, and painful blisters will not be a positive memory. Please also include plenty of socks as a camper sometimes will go through several pair in a day.

The check-in process at camp requires a health screening. We look forward to serving your child, however, we reserve the right to refuse admission to any camper with a communicable disease. Please be advised that we expect campers with chronic health problems to be capable of self-management while at camp.
