

Logging Update Around the Lake

We wanted to give you the heads up that loggers have been working around the area this spring. As shown in the above map, the main logging areas have been to the east of Magee Road and to the south of Thumb Lake road. (The specific logging stands are marked in red in the map above.) As you'll see, this has not been a clear-cut, but it is noticeable when you drive (or walk) by.

Logging has historically been a source of revenue for the community, and many of these trees were planted decades ago with the intention of eventually being logged to support the LLCC. This latest harvest was more extensive than originally anticipated, given the presence of some pests in the red pine stands and the need to cut down the trees while they were still marketable. Due to the maturity of many of the tree stands around the lake, this is likely to be the last harvest for a significant period of time.

Community Vegetable Garden this summer

The LLCC staff is planning to start a community vegetable garden on the camp grounds. Local food pantries often lack fresh vegetables, and the idea is to grow vegetables that will then be donated to the Boyne Falls Food Pantry.

Volunteers are needed to help this worthwhile effort, and the schedule is flexible. Please be on the lookout for updates (or, for all the planners out there, sign up now!).

Special Use Dumpsters return in late June

As you think about cleaning out your cabin, remember that the regular dumpsters are for kitchen and household garbage only.

We will again be providing special use dumpsters for a period this summer at the end of June (most likely starting June 28-30). They will be located at the end of Meadows Trail and of Pioneer Trail, and the dumpsters provide a great way to dispose of larger (non-hazardous) items from your cottage.
